event, featuring the "Mood Swing" Band and Soloist, "Sam Gross", will be postponed to a future date, due to the uprise of the Delta


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to do so.

COVID IN BERLIN

Kathy Rae Huffman is currently spending time in Berlin, Germany reconnecting with friends she made while living there many years. She was able to moderate an online panel: Digital Power - Intersectional Resistance, Advocacy and Activism in International Feminist Techno-Decolonial Art, a panel for the 2021 conference SIGGRAPH.

She shared some of her experiences with living in Berlin during the time of Covid, which are very different from our experiences living here in Southern California as well as the US.

Kathy writes:

As some of you might be aware, I've been in Berlin now for almost 5 weeks, returning home on August 31, 2021. Here, masks are dominant everywhere. And, not just any mask! It is required to wear an approved KN95 masks (in some places surgical masks are ok). People wear them on their arms using the elastic as an armband, like a badge (and also so that they are easy to grab and put on quickly). No homemade masks or bandana type face coverings are allowed. For example, you will be fined 500 Euros on the spot for not wearing a proper mask on public transport (which 85% of Berliners use daily).

Furthermore, it is required to sign in anywhere that is an inside event, for contact tracing. Berlin is an active city, but bars, restaurants, galleries, museums are all on board. All require proof of vaccination (with an accompanying ID) or a negative COVID test from that very day to enter! It is taken very seriously here. Markets and shops have a guard at the doors to remind people to mask up (assuming they just forgot). No mask = no entry. Just to let you know how it is someplace else.

Before I return, I must test negative with a PCR Covid-19 test, within 72 hours of departure, which will cost me 80 Euros! (199 Euros if I get a same day test).

I won't be able to board the plane without this test certificate. In case you are wondering, the actual flight back to LAX will be pretty empty, since only US passport holders (or green card holders) are allowed into the US from EU countries at the moment. The airports, however, are quite problematic, and crowded...even though everyone, and I mean EVERYONE, is masked. Travel these days is not for the timid!

On the brighter side, people are coping well, are optimistic, and continue meeting outside. Simple COVID testing is available in every neighborhood for free. Test takes 15 minutes to get results. Everyone has developed their own social routine but eating on the sidewalk at a small table is normal now! Nobody eats inside! Even if it is raining. The streets are pretty full late at night, mostly very young people (20s) hanging out before their school term starts. That's problematic. But galleries have started having openings, film screenings, and lectures again. I'm in heaven! Busy every day and night.

See you all soon! Take care, and be safe. People who are in the high risk category, especially due to age, should take no chances. This virus is incredibly nasty.

VOICE NOTES BY SUSIE GLAZE

What is "Authentic Emotion" in Song Performance? AUTHENTIC OR "ORGANIC"

In my theatre days, my fellow students of the acting craft and I placed a lot of importance on what we called "organic emotion." We kept our eyes and ears peeled for performances that were filled with empty gestures, posturing and histrionics, often referred to in a derogatory way as "chewing the scenery." You've probably seen singers perform and you can tell they don't really feel the words they're singing. What's happening is that they are replacing real feeling with physical indications of an emotion. This process of <u>indicating</u> is very different from allowing yourself to FEEL the pain, the joy, the fear, the sadness, the love. The first is empty, and the second is the profound, might I even say "transcendent?"

We use the word "organic" because it means "real," not processed. In performance art, the word is used to describe the use of real emotions, connections made with the characters in the song using empathy. We don't talk enough about empathy in today's world. Empathy allows us to feel what someone else might be feeling and feeling it for ourselves. Through the use of your empathy, you can actually "take a walk in someone else's shoes." Empathy in expressive art comes to the aid of authenticity. You don't have to "be" the person in the song, but you can feel what they are going through with the use of your empathetic imagination. When you are expressing yourself this way, your work has authentic emotion.

In my singing work, I always keep strictly to the practice of dipping down into the real emotions I feel myself, accessing the imaginative realm where I connect with the characters' stories, whether tragic or joyful, and let myself feel these things while I sing. As yourself: how is it for them (the song's characters)? Have I ever felt that way before, from a similar circumstance? You don't have to be literal with the circumstance, but you do have to be real with the feelings. Your feelings have roots inside your heart and they go deep for you. Dip down into where they are, allow them to be in the room. This is the authenticity you need to put a song across with real truth, real depth.

So: know the story, feel the message, let yourself get into the story, the characters – let the emotion drop in, then open your mouth to sing! Someone once said to me, and it's so true – "It's powerful because it's real."
